

Ideas For the Future

NEW PROGRAMS AND FUNCTIONS

1. RESEARCH

- a. Locate existing documents and original sources of information to learn more about Herricks/Eyryks throughout the Midlands.
- b. Study forensic data on Viking remains to reinforce or discount our claims to Viking heritage and links to Ericke of East Anglia.
- c. Study church records to learn more about the life and times of Robert de Stretton and his brother William Eyryk (when and why he was knighted by King Edward III)
- d. Starting with Thomas Heyrick (Henry's father) trace and verify ancestral roots back as far as possible.
- e. Study migration paths of our ancestors from Henry of Salem westward through the US.
- f. Study Herrick involvement in Colonial wars, French and Indian war, Revolutionary war, War of 1812, and Civil war.

2. SERVICE

- a. Conduct Herrick family genealogy searches free for members and fee based for non-members.
- b. Help members with DAR and SAR memberships.

3. DNA

- a. Study new developments in family DNA and maintain a data base of member DNA profiles.
- b. Study Viking DNA matches to Herrick family DNA profiles.
- c. Study new developments in isotope analysis of Viking remains.

4. EDUCATION


- a. Provide academic scholarships for members or non-members and their families to conduct research on Herrick genealogy.

Obituary

Robert T. Herrick, HFA #067

Robert was born in Clarendon, Vermont on August 20th, 1931, the son of William Torrey and Ruth (Squier) Herrick, and passed away on February 1, 2024, at the age of ninety-two.

Robert Torrey Herrick lived at 609 HWY 466, 1111, Lady Lake, Florida, 32159. He had a secondary location at 512 Valley Creek Road, Rochester, NY 14624.

Robert graduated from Clarendon Grammar School in 1945 and from Rutland High School in 1949. As a young man, he was active in his church's youth group and the 4-H Club, as a member and leader. While in High School he enlisted in the Vermont National Guard (at the age of sixteen) and then served in the United States

Army and both the Army National Guard and the United States Army Reserve, continuously until reaching the age of 60 when he was Honorably Discharged having obtained the rank of Colonel.

He achieved the rank of Master Sergeant until commissioned as an officer on September 14th, 1953. He completed several different military courses of instruction and was a graduate of the United States Army Command and General Staff College and the Industrial College of the Armed Forces.

He was the recipient of many distinct awards and decorations and was a member of the Military Officers Association of America and the Lady Lake, Florida Chapter thereof.

Colonel Herrick was the 11th generation in America of ancestors who were Pilgrims and Puritans. He was interested in Genealogy and was a member of The Herrick Family Association of America.

He was a lifelong Congregationalist having been a member of the Old Brick Church in Clarendon, Vermont, and for years a member of the South Congregational Church of Centerville, Massachusetts.

Robert also owned a dairy farm in Danby, Vermont, and thereafter was employed by the New York Insurance Company, Commercial Credit Corporation, Kaiser Jeep Corporation, and then as a civilian technician in the New York National Guard from which in retired in 1985.

Surviving Colonel Herrick is his wife Ann M. Herrick, sister Jane Hall of Tucson, Arizona, and brother Dr. William C. Herrick of Wilmot, New Hampshire. Surviving children are Deborah Buskirk of Ownes Cross Roads, Alabama, Patricia Scace of Madison Heights, MI, Pamela Roberts of Matthews, NC, and Robert T. Herrick Jr of Nassau, New York., eleven grandchildren, twenty-one great-grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren. Preceding Colonel Herrick in death was his infant son John, daughter Susan Bloomer, former wife Jacqueline, and former companion Elizabeth Lindberg.

A graveside service will be at the East Clarendon Cemetery, in Clarendon, Vermont, at noon on Sunday, May 26^{th.} Colonel Herrick will be having a Military Honors Funeral with Chaplin, Taps, and Flag presentation. A Celebration of Life reception will follow the graveside service at the North Clarendon Town Hall.
